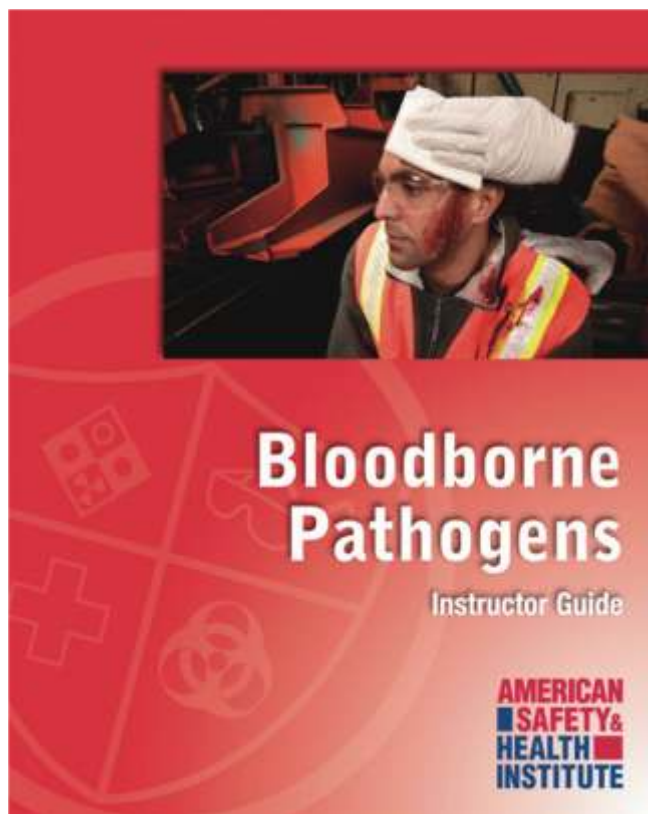


This Bloodborne Pathogens training program will provide Participants with the essential knowledge necessary to help reduce or eliminate occupational Bloodborne Pathogens.
